FROM FR. SIEG

Memorial Day reminded me of the many different ways in which we all seek to show our love and respect for those who have died, especially our friends and members of our families.

Among Catholics, it has been a custom to ask a priest to offer Mass with the intention of praying for an individual, or family members, who have died. This custom began hundreds of years ago and has been an important way for us to remember and pray for the dead.

Since I am the only priest assigned to St. Michael there are bound to be some limits on the number of Mass requests that we can accept. Beyond that, it would be good for you to know that every pastor must offer one Mass for the People of the Parish on every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. Priests are also required to offer three Masses for every priest of the Archdiocese when he dies. In trying to be as fair as possible to all, we do have some standard policies about this issue.

When an individual dies and there are a large number of requests made that a Mass be offered for that person, it is impossible that all the Masses be celebrated here. Depending on the available dates, we normally will schedule one Sunday Mass and three weekday Mass for that individual. We then encourage the family to send the other financial "stipends" and requests to missionaries. Many send these requests to the Franciscans at the Prior Lake Retreat House. The Masses will be offered as requested and the missionary work of the Church will be helped at the same time.

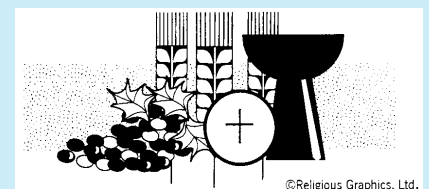

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

From Fr. Sieg...Continued

When a parishioner comes to the office desiring that several Masses be offered for several different intentions, we will schedule only four Masses to be celebrated here. We recommend that other stipends and intentions be sent to religious orders. While an individual may ask that a Mass be offered for more than one person (e.g. their parents, their siblings, etc.), Canon Law does not allow us to accept two entirely different intentions from two different people for one Mass.

We accept requests for one year at a time. Because certain dates have special meaning to some people we will try to fulfill requests for Mass on a specific day but we will not accept requests for the same special date over a number of years. A particular date must be requested each year.

I realize that the limited number of days we have available for special Mass intentions can lead to disappointment for some people. I do hope that people will come to see the great value in sending their requests to missionary orders. This way their request can be granted and the missionary work of the Church can be supported. Finally, I would note that the Archdiocese has set the amount of the "donation" for each Mass at \$7.00. All of these guidelines also apply to Masses offered for the living.
